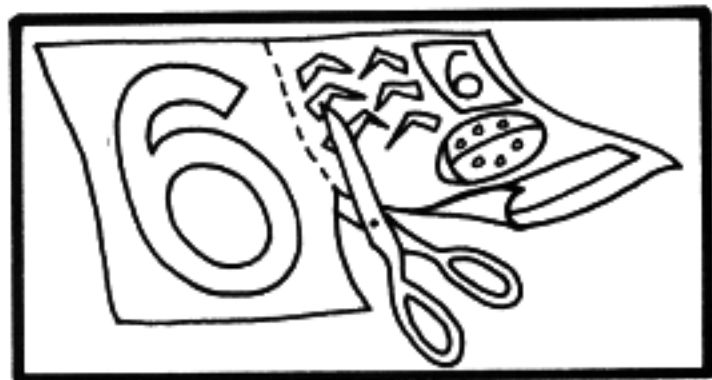
The teacher's guide offers instructions for art projects and activities for building the following skills:

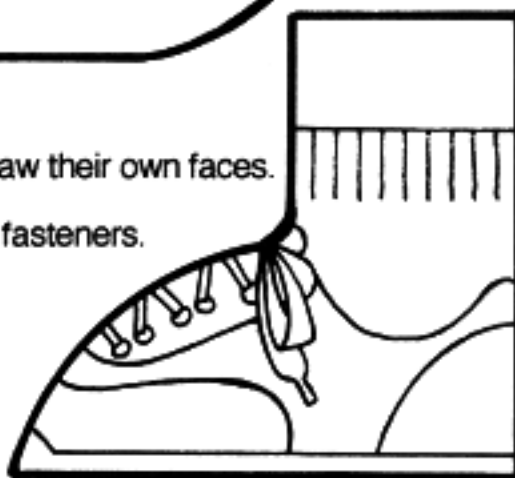
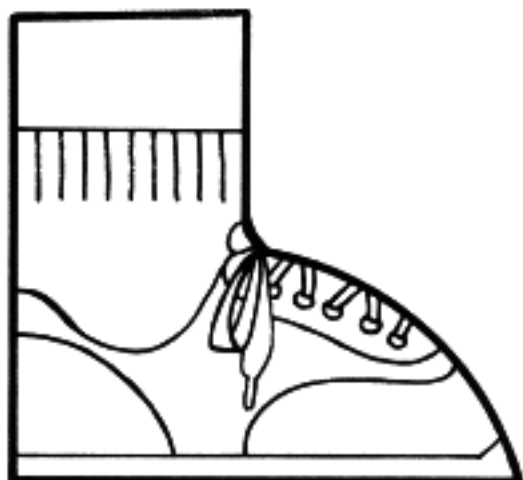
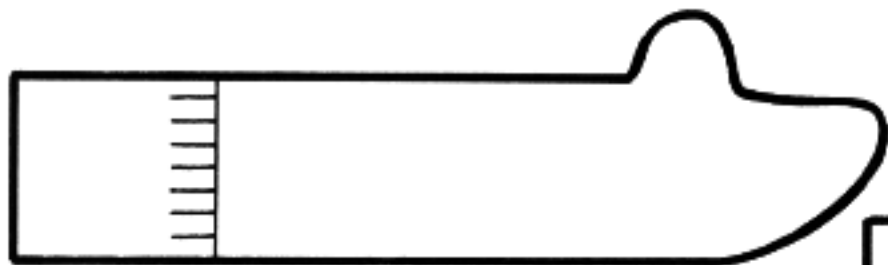
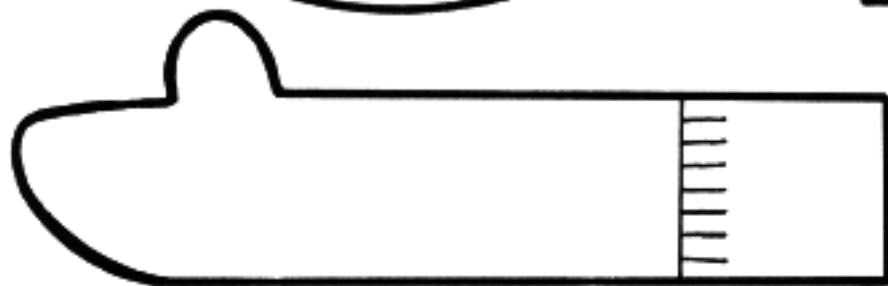
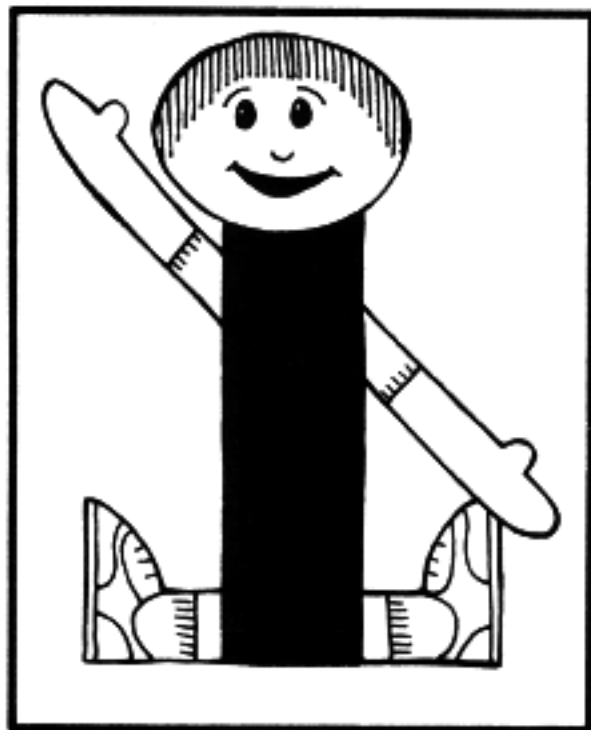
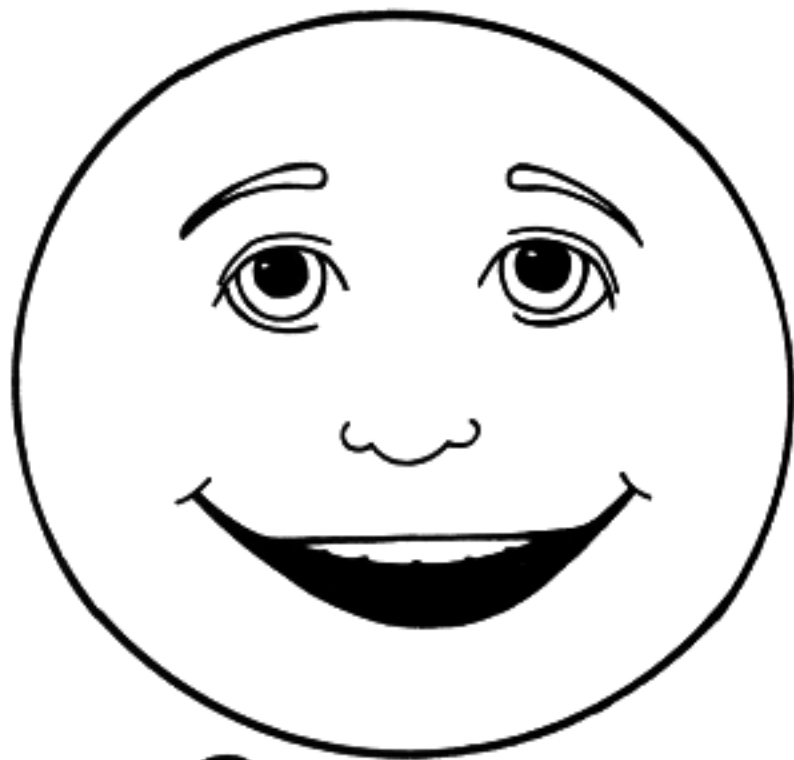
1. numeral recognition
2. numeral and number (set) association
3. number word recognition
4. numeric order / counting

### ART PROJECTS WITH LARGE NUMERALS

#### SKILL: numeral recognition

1. Reproduce the numeral on construction paper for each child. Reproduce the pattern parts to go with that numeral on bond paper for each child. Let the children color the pattern pieces and cut out both the pieces and the numeral.
2. We recommend oral instruction, while demonstrating once or twice where the pieces are to be glued (good practice for following directions). The corner picture showing the finished project may also be displayed. Assembling the pieces onto the numeral in approximately the correct place provides good visual skill practice.
3. To make a number book, glue each entire project to a sheet of construction paper and glue the poem strip to the bottom of each page. Punch two holes in each page along the left side and tie the pages together with yarn.





The face can be blanked out so children can draw their own faces.  
Yarn can be used for hair.  
The arms and legs can be attached with brass fasteners.
